| Dr. DeBraber, urologist | Men who desire a vasectomy, but are uninsured, have insurance that does not cover contraception or have Health Plan of MI or Molina Medicaid HMO plans | A vasectomy is a permanent form of birth control available to men. | Dr. DeBraber will accept payment for vasectomies from Molina or Health Plan of MI Medicaid HMOs. For men who are uninsured or underinsured, he charges a flat rate of \$500. | Call Judy, the office manager @ (231) 773-3228 |
| Emergency Contraception (Plan B) | Any woman who seeks Emergency Contraception (EC) or Plan B due to sexual assault or a birth control failure | An online referral source, listing pharmacies and providers that will prescribe or dispense EC/Plan B. | In order to purchase over the counter, a woman must be at least 17 years old. The cost is approximately \$50 without a prescription, but many insurance plans will cover. | Website: www.not-2-late.com |
| Fountain Street Church Choice Fund | Women who seek an abortion, but cannot afford one | Provides financial assistance and loans to help women pay for abortions | The amount covered varies and is based upon a woman's individual situation. | Walgreens Prescription Savings Club | Women who are uninsured or who lack contraceptive coverage under their health insurance plan | For a yearly membership fee (\$20 for individual or \$35 for a family), participants receive discounts on common prescription drugs. Under the plan, a woman can purchase Trinessa for \$12/mo. or OrthoTriCyclen or Spring Tec for \$9/mo. | Anyone who does not already have insurance coverage under a publicly funded health care program. | Ask the pharmacist at any Walgreens or go online to: www.walgreens.com/rxsavingsclub |
| Walmart Pharmacy | Women who are uninsured or who lack contraceptive coverage under their health insurance plan | They have a list of reduced-priced prescription drugs, including Sprintec and TriSprintec, which cost \$9/mo. | No membership requirements.
