



The Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening Program (BCCCP) was able to screen 601 women who may have otherwise not had access to screening services during Fiscal Year 2011. Of the 601 women screened, 10 women were diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer. These 10 women were enrolled in Medicaid for the treatment of their cancer. Yearly screening services provide earlier detection of cancer. If cancer is detected, treatment is able to begin right away giving more women the opportunity to a future that is cancer free.

The Family Planning Project (FP) was able to provide 101 young women colposcopy services as follow-up to abnormal pap smears. Fifteen young women were diagnosed with pre-cancerous cells and enrolled in Medicaid for treatment. Diagnostic testing provided these young women with early treatment and follow-up to abnormal pap smears.

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) is the primary cause of pre-cancerous cells found on abnormal pap smears. HPV is preventable by immunizing all boys and girls ages 9-26 years with a three shot series. The HPV series is available through Public Health Muskegon County's (PHMC) Immunization Program.

High unemployment, poor economy and lack of insurance for many of our Muskegon County women are all reasons for assuring that these programs continue.

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Basis for Program

In 1990, Congress passed the Breast and Cervical Cancer Mortality Act. Since 1991, the Michigan Department of Community Health has implemented a Breast and Cervical Cancer Control Program (BCCCP) through a multi-year grant from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. With the funds from this grant, women can receive life-saving cancer screening services and follow-up care, including cancer treatment if necessary. BCCCP services are coordinated through 21 local Coordinating Agencies. These agencies partner with physicians, hospitals and other health care organizations to provide all necessary screenings, follow-up care and education.

In addition to the BCCCP program, the Title X/Family Planning Project was created as an extension of the original BCCCP program. Title X funds are then matched by the BCCCP program, which creates a program to provide cervical screening services for young women. Young women are eligible for Title X services if they utilize Planned Parenthood of Muskegon County or any of the Ottawa County Health Department locations.

Enrollment Criteria

Breast & Cervical Cancer Control Program

- Must be a Michigan resident
- Women must be between the ages of 40-64
- Income level requirement: 2009 Federal Poverty Level Guidelines
- Uninsured or Underinsured (insurance that has high deductibles or does not cover screening services).

Family Planning Project

- Must be a Michigan resident
- Women must be between the ages of 19-39
- Income level requirement: 2009 Federal Poverty Level Guidelines
- Uninsured or Underinsured (insurance that has high deductibles or does not cover colposcopy services).

Purpose of the Program

Breast & Cervical Cancer Control Program

- To offer breast and cervical cancer screening to the eligible women of Muskegon and Ottawa Counties;
- To provide follow-up care for abnormal findings found during breast and cervical screening services; and
- To facilitate Medicaid enrollment for those women who are diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer, enabling them to obtain treatment without worrying about how they are going to pay for services.

Family Planning Project

- To provide direct coordination with Planned Parenthood –to facilitate referrals of young women into the Title X/Family Planning project to receive diagnostic services for abnormal Pap smear results.
- To offer early treatment and follow-up to abnormal pap smears (colposcopy services) to eligible young women of Muskegon and Ottawa counties;
- To facilitate Medicaid enrollment for those young women who are diagnosed with pre-cancerous pap smears (CIN II or CIN III), to obtain treatment.

CIN I – mild (only a few) abnormal cells found

CIN II – moderate, about half of the thickness of the surface lining of the cervix is involved.

CIN III or carcinoma in situ (CIS) – the entire thickness of cells is disordered-if this condition is not treated, it will often grow into an invasive cervical cancer.

Invasive Cervical Cancer – cells are not only disordered throughout the entire thickness of the lining, but they invade the tissue underlying the surface.

Community Value

Breast & Cervical Cancer Control Program

- The BCCCP was able to screen 601 Muskegon and Ottawa County women received screening services.
- 10 women were diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer.
- These 10 women were enrolled in Medicaid for the treatment of their cancer.

- Yearly screening services provide earlier detection of cancer. If cancer is detected, treatment is able to begin right away giving more women the opportunity to a future that is cancer free.
- Coordination with 5 medical offices and their providers, to directly provide cancer-screening services for women participating in the BCCCP.

Family Planning Project

- 101 young women received colposcopy services as follow-up to abnormal pap smears.
- 15 were diagnosed with pre-cancerous (CIN II or CIN III) cells and enrolled in Medicaid for treatment.
- Coordination with 2 medical offices to directly provide diagnostic follow-up for the young women participating in the Title X/Family Planning project.

Upcoming Year

Breast & Cervical Cancer Control Program

Due to funding cuts, Fiscal Year 2012 caseload numbers have been reduced to 597. Due to the reduction in caseload, fewer women in Muskegon and Ottawa counties will be able to be screened for breast and cervical cancer. Funding for women aged 40-49 years of age is being cut in Fiscal Year 2013. Prioritization of women in this age group is needed so that only women who have a history of cancer, previous abnormal mammograms or pap smears or a family history of cancer are screened.

Family Planning Project

Fiscal Year 2012 Family Planning caseload numbers have been reduced to 62. Due to this reduction in caseload, fewer young women with abnormal pap smears will be served.

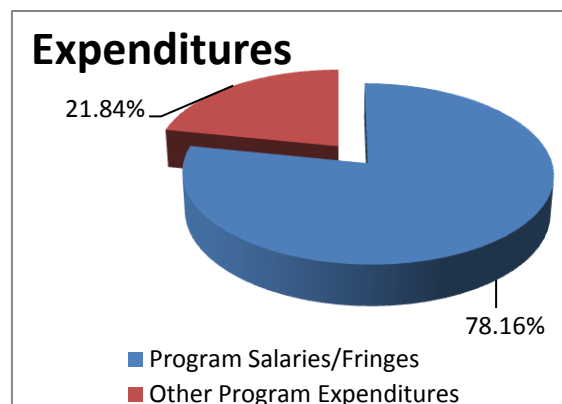
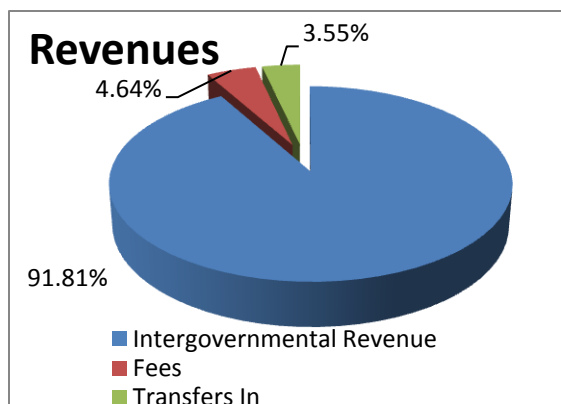
